Online access to 1098-T and Understanding Reportable Amounts

Online Access to 1098-T forms generated by Coconino Community College Accounts Receivable department are available through MyCCC.

How can I view my 1098-T online?

Log into the MyCCC web portal at (Ctrl + Click to follow link)

On the website menu bar, select Self Service (Web4). Once you are logged into your Self Service account, select the Student Services tab, Student Records, Tax Notification, enter a Tax Year, and Submit. If you do not have a 1098-T for that Tax Year, you will be returned to the selection menu.

Box 1: CCC processes 1098-Ts by Charges accrued during the tax year. This means you will not see an amount within this box.

Box 2: Sum of all charges the student has accrued during the tax year. If you accrued charges during the tax year, you will see an amount within this box.

Box 3: If the college decides to change their reporting method to Payments made during the tax year this box will be checked. This is not applicable.

Box 4: If there are changes during the current tax year, to your charges for a prior year the sum will display here.

Box 5: Sum of all Scholarships or Grants received during the tax year.

Box 6: If there are changes during the current tax year, to your Scholarships or Grants for a prior year the sum will display here.

Box 7: If there are charges during the current tax year that apply to the 2017 Spring Term, then this box will be checked. For example, this would occur if you register for Spring Term 2017, within the 2016 tax year.

Box 8: If you are registered for more than 6 credits during the current tax year, then this box will be checked.

Box 9: CCC does not offer Graduate level courses, so this box will not be checked.

Box 10: This scenario does not apply to CCC.

Why didn't I receive Form 1098-T?

We only mail 1098-T forms if you have a reportable transaction during the tax year. If your Financial Aid is more than what is billed, a 1098-T may not be mailed to you.

- ❖ CCC does not have a valid Mailing Address on file for you.
 - Please make sure you update your current mailing address prior to January 1st of each year. You must also inactivate all invalid mailing addresses.
- ❖ CCC does not have a valid Social Security # for you.
 - Please make sure you contact registration if you have not provided a valid SSN during time of registration. You will need to fill out a W-9S form.
- ❖ Your Scholarships and Grants exceed the Charges accrued during the current tax year.
- ❖ All reporting amounts equal zero.
 - This could happen if you drop all classes during the 100% refund period.
