Emergency Medical Technician Program

Course: EMS 131 Emergency Medical Technician, 8 credit hours (letter grade)

Course Description: Emergency Medical Technician course using the 2009 curriculum adapted by the Arizona Department of Health Services. This course will help prepare students for the National Registry of EMTs and certification as an AZ EMT.

Prerequisites:

- **Government issued Identification Card** - Student must be 18 years of age by the last day of class.
- **Vaccination documentation as required by clinical institutions:**
 - Proof of full **COVID-19** vaccination (2 Moderna, 2 Pfizer or 1 Johnson and Johnson)
 - Proof of a **Negative TB skin test** within 6 months prior to the beginning of class (or chest X-Ray within 2 years)
 - Proof of **2 Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR)** immunizations or **positive blood titer verified by a physician**
 - **Tdap** or **DTaP** (Tetanus, Diptheria and Pertusis) within the last 10 years
OR TD (Tetanus and Diptheria) within the last two years
 - Proof of **2 Varicella** (Chicken Pox) immunizations or **positive blood titer verified by a physician**
 - Proof of a **flu vaccine** for Fall/Spring semesters. May be delayed until start of the Fall semester.

***These vaccination requirements are subject to change at the discretion of the clinical provider institution (Northern Arizona Healthcare or Banner Health).**

*Exemptions are considered on a case by case basis by the clinical provider Employee Health office.

- **CPR:** Must be issued by one of the certifications listed below and be valid through the end of the class.
 - American Heart Association - **BLS Provider (Preferred)**
 - American Red Cross - **CPR for the Professional Rescuer**
 - ASHI - **CPR Pro**
 - **Reading Comprehension Verification*:**
 - **Pre-requisite or placement into Course: RDG 99 Fundamentals of Composition, 4 credits***
Course Description: A multi-pronged approach that includes mastery of college reading skills enhanced with supplemental reading, critical thinking, and reading fluency activities. Prerequisite: ENG 095 or placement beyond prerequisite course. May be taken for S/U credit. Four lecture.
- OR**
- **Pre-requisite or placement into: ENG 101A or ENG 101, 3 credits***
Course Description: Requires practice in writing, rhetoric, and reasoning, with emphasis on using the writing process to compose college level essays. Prerequisites: *ENG 099 and *RDG 099 or placement. General Education: Composition. Three lecture
- OR**
- **A high school graduation unweighted GPA of 2.75 or higher.**

*Placement scores or academic history (unofficial transcript) of completing one of the courses above will be required for registration.

- **N-95 PPE fit testing** to be conducted in your class.

To register for this class bring all documents that show you meet the pre-requisite requirements to Enrollment Services at the Fourth Street Campus.
