ACADEMIC AFFAIRS:

Page Campus

Career and Technical Education

National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (February 8, 2017), the construction industry has lost 40% (2.3 million) of its workforce due to the recession from 2006-2011. That number increased to 56% in July 2016 due to the growth in the economy. In an effort to prepare CCC students to compete in this high demand job market, Ken Myers from the Construction Management department has completed the NCCER Instructor Certification Training Program. NCCER was developed with the support of more than 125 construction CEOs and various association and academic leaders who united to revolutionize training for the construction industry. Sharing the common goal of developing a safe and productive workforce, these companies created a standardized training and credentialing program for the construction industry. This progressive program has evolved into curricula for more than 70 craft areas and a complete series of more than 70 assessments offered in over 4,000 NCCER-accredited training and assessment locations across the United States. The goal for the Construction Management department is to become an accredited training site and start offering this training to CCC students in the Fall of 2017.

Certified Apartment Management Technician (CAMT)

For the fourth consecutive year, CCC has partnered with Goodwill International, the Coconino County Career Center, and the National Apartment Association to provide the CAMT program. This program provides students with job skills and hands on training in the apartment and building maintenance industry. The 104-hour training program includes topics such as interior and exterior finishes, electrical installation, plumbing systems, heating-ventilation-air conditioning systems, and appliance maintenance. Each student that successfully completes the program receives six separate national industry certifications and most graduates have jobs before they complete the program. The course will run from March 6, 2017 to April 6, 2017 and be taught by David Cain and Jerry Reinhart with support from Ken Myers and Bill Randall.

Emergency Medical Services/Fire Science

- The 2017 Emergency Medical Services cohort has started and includes 20 students and a new lead instructor, David Taggart who replaced Curtis Eddie when he returned to work as a field paramedic.
- Of the 44 students that took the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) exam after the fall semester, 29 have passed and are now certified.
- The pediatric HAL manikin has been received and will be in service before spring break.
- David Manning and Marc Goldberg attended a two-day training session on the new fire simulation program that was purchased with Perkins funding. The program will be used to build emergency medical services simulations.

Perkins Grant Support

Perkins Grant funds were used to purchase portable radios for the Fire Science Program, injection training materials for the Allied Health and Nursing Programs, and non-fiction literacy training for the Computer Science, Allied Health, Administration of Justice, Construction Management, and Nursing courses.

Perkins Grant funds were also used to sponsor professional development opportunities for Construction Management faculty to attend the National Center for Construction Education and Research training and for two Nursing/Allied Health faculty and the Director of Nursing to attend a concept based curriculum training session.

BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES:

Information Technology (IT)

- The resiliency and functionality of the College's business continuity arrangement was recently improved as a result of deploying external name servers at all three of sites (Lone Tree, Page, and Fourth Street). This project is a part of the disaster recovery efforts.
- Two classrooms in Lone Tree are using the latest video collaboration technology from Cisco, providing high definition video, active speaker tracking, and touch screen controls. With a CCC Foundation grant, the same rooms were equipped with advanced audio collection and mixing for distribution of high quality sound to the Page site.
- Five digital displays have been installed on the Lone Tree campus to display content relevant to students.

Marketing and PR have completed a website design and style guide for the updated CCC website. Training for web editors will begin the first week of March. In response to additional feedback from faculty members, the date of the new website's launch has been postponed until after the semester ends.
