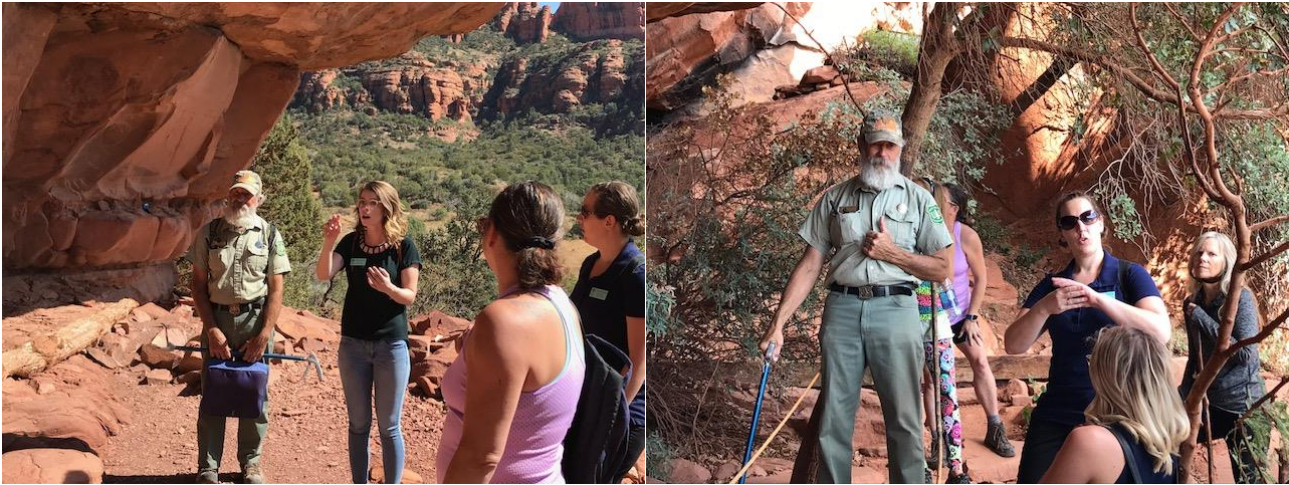
### **Arts and Sciences**

The Arizona Languages Association, also known as AZLA, held its annual language conference at Glendale Community College on October 6-7, 2017. CCC Spanish Faculty, Katie Schwartz, attended this year as a first-time presenter where she shared her research and teaching strategies on the subject of “How to achieve the 5 world-readiness standards of ACTFL with the use of music in the language classroom”. ACTFL stands for the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages. Katie’s presentation was voted Best of AZLA 2017 by the attendees and the AZLA Executive Board. She will receive a \$300 stipend from AZLA to present again at the Southwest Council on Language Teaching in Santa Fe, New Mexico in February 2018.

Tom Lehman attended the mid-year Board meeting for the Human Anatomy & Physiology Society in Columbus, Ohio October 13-15, 2017. The Board reviewed the organization’s strategic plan and prepared for the annual conference next May in the same city and at the same institution (The Ohio State University). Tom also attended the Colorado EMS conference in Keystone, Colorado on November 2-5, 2017.

On Thursday, October 19, 2017, three students from the American Sign Language (ASL) Interpreting Program had the opportunity to practice their skills in Sedona at the Palatki Heritage Site. Their instructor, Sarah Benton, was contacted by a Palatki volunteer to assist a group of five Deaf individuals who with a tour of the heritage site. This opportunity was a day of rich language exposure as the students interpreted and interacted with these visitors and was featured in an article in the Arizona Daily Sun.





The CCC ASL Club hosted an American Sign Language (ASL) Family Fun Day at the Lone Tree campus on Saturday, October 21, 2017. With the guidance of ASL faculty, Nicole Moots, and club advisor, Sarah Benton, the students contacted agencies serving deaf and hard of hearing children such as the Arizona Schools for the Deaf and Blind North Central Regional Cooperative, and Arizona Hands and Voices. These agencies hosted booths to share information along with games and activities for attendees. Ken Myers, Construction and Sustainable Building faculty, donated wood for a huge jenga set which a club member constructed and painted CCC teal. The day culminated in a game show skit put on by the students. Members of the audience challenged the “experts” in an ASL Family Feud type game.

### Career and Technical Education

Jeff Jones attended the Advanced Technical Education Primary Investigators Conference in Washington, DC and served on panel discussion focusing on how rural Arizona colleges collectively engage K-14 students in science, engineering, technology, and math. Jeff also attended to investigate funding for new programs such as Cybersecurity, Biomedical Technician, Unmanned Aircraft, and Additive Manufacturing.

Nineteen students from the Construction Technology Management Program completed the first OSHA 10 authorized training course offered at CCC in the past ten years. Each student spent 12 hours in the classroom and lab discussing topics such as OSHA’s Fatal Four, Hand and Power Tool Safety, Personal Protective Equipment, and Hazard Recognition. This is the first of 4 new industry certificates that the Construction Management Program is offering to students in Sustainable Building Trades.

Economics faculty member, Adam Gifford, is reworking both economics courses (ECN204 and ECN205) to implement the use of a free, open-source textbook. This will save students approximately \$300 in textbook costs for both classes. All economics courses will be using this new text starting in the Spring 2018 semester. Adam completed a running race on Thanksgiving morning. Some of the proceeds for the event benefitted the CCC Outdoor Club and CCC employees were been offered free entry in exchange for a donation to the CCC Outdoor Club.

The Fire Science (FSC) 136 Course - Fire Apparatus and Hydraulics class recently participated in a practical skills evening at the Flagstaff Fire Training Facility. Students had an opportunity to take classroom information and apply it on actual fire trucks flowing water. Flagstaff Fire Fighter Katie Brown and Flagstaff Fire Captain Seth Gregar volunteered their time to help teach students the practical application of classroom knowledge.





The Medical Assistant program has 4 students who will complete their internships this semester. This is the second class to complete the program since changes were made to shorten the program to two semesters. Physician offices are contacting James requesting CCC students. The changes to the program have been very successful and are due to the work of James Clark.

Applications for the nursing program are now available online and in the Nursing Department for the Fall 2018 class. Applications are due on March 5, 2018 at noon. The application website has been updated to reflect changes to the application process and the Nursing Program and Student Development are collaborating to offer information sessions for students interested in applying. The Nursing Program would like to thank Brian Francis and Nichole Gregory for their assistance with the information sessions.

The Nursing Program and Student Development are collaborating with NAU to provide a Concurrent Associate/Baccalaureate Degree Nursing Program (CEP). This program would enable nursing students to be enrolled in the CCC Nursing Program and be taking NAU BSN courses at the same time allowing the student to graduate with their AAS and BSN degrees on the same day!

Students in the Nursing Program were asked to vote on whether they would like to keep the current nursing pinning ceremony or to combine that ceremony with commencement. Of the 49 students who voted, 31 voted to keep the nursing pinning ceremony. There will be a couple of changes to the May 2018 nursing pinning ceremony. Students will be able to choose dresses or pants for the ceremony and refreshments will be served to family and friends.

First semester Nursing students began their clinical experience the week of October 23, 2017 and will be participating in clinicals through the first week of December at The Coconino County Health Department and The Peaks. Some of our Nursing students volunteered at the Food Back the week before Thanksgiving and passed out turkeys to community members.

### Page Campus

The Higher Education Consortium Project met at NAU on October 23, 2017 with key players from the four partner institutions from the areas of admissions, registration, financial aid, fee payment, and academics. There were 30 people in attendance. The project is moving forward with a proposed name and mission and vision statements that are being reviewed by the partner college's Presidents. Biology and chemistry courses (BIO 181 and CHM 130) are being offered Spring term for interested consortium students. The courses are hybrid courses with live labs and classroom time in Page every other Friday. Computer lab help and tutoring will also be available on Fridays in Page.

The Page Instructional Site hosted several community meetings over the last month including Coconino County Community and Economic Development, Arizona Department of Child Services/Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), and ETD Inc. of Flagstaff (a professional support service for Native American communities). The Page Campus is thrilled with the interest in community groups using our wonderful space and the meetings brought over 100 people to the Page Instructional Site.

## HUMAN RESOURCES:

Human Resources now has a representative on the Fourth Street Innovation Center for half a day, two days a month with all members of the HR staff rotating through the opportunity. HR is developing an action plan for those visits including mandatory building walk-throughs, scheduling regular Human Resources activities there such as new hire orientations, and having office hours to meet the needs of Fourth Street Innovation Center staff.

Human Resources has diversified their advertising strategy and ran the College's first English/Navajo recruitment ad in October.

Dietrich Sauer, Executive Director of Human Resources, recently served as the keynote speaker for the Northern Arizona Human Resources Association Luncheon. His speech focused on best places to work strategies. Dietrich also presented at a Goodwill resource event providing attendees with an update on current events in Human Resources

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION:

Information Technology (IT) now has the ability to retain archival logs for forensics and troubleshooting and will be working towards maintaining 4 to 6 months of records. IT will be adding additional archival logs for systems and will bring that process with systems that are the most likely to experience inappropriate activity. This logging has already been useful to the IT Department and has helped increase the College's cyber security.

IT participated in a thorough system, process, data, and organization audit with the State of Arizona. A highlight of the audit was the auditors' review of the Disaster Recovery/Business Continuity process where they noted that CCC was ahead of the other State community colleges. Well done to the IT team!!

## INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT:

### Graphic Design, Marketing, and PR

- In October, the PR Department produced the Fall 2017 edition of the CCC Star and facilitated the publication of the Spring 2018 Schedule of Classes.
- The internal newsletter CoCoConnections went from a monthly to a weekly rotation in October to better disseminate information to the College community.
- The CocoNotions newsletter is reaching more people and being distributed to a more extensive email list.
- The PR Coordinator offered story coverage and photography services at several CCC-related events and activities in Flagstaff and Page, including Career and Tech Round-Up, Hispanic Heritage Month, Native American Heritage Month, Page Balloon Regatta, LAUNCH Flagstaff Town Hall, the Fine Arts Department, the Northern Arizona Book Festival event at CCC's Lone Tree campus (also a video of this event), and more.
- The two PR and Marketing interns provided story coverage and photography services to additional CCC-related events in October and November, and both received publication credit in outside publications for their portfolios.
- The PR Coordinator and film intern produced videos for the TRiO first-generation celebration and the Veteran Days observance. The PR Coordinator produced a video of the Nursing Orientation event.
- To assist with marketing and PR at the Fourth Street Innovation Center, the PR Coordinator is now attending weekly meetings with faculty and staff at the Fourth Street Innovation Center.
- The Graphic Designer completed many projects in October and November including layouts for ongoing publications like the CCC Star and Class Schedule; special graphics for projects like the ILab at the Fourth Street Innovation Center and bus advertisements; promotional pieces, display graphics, and banners for events like the Balloon Regatta and several of the President's Listening Sessions; and miscellaneous layouts for graphics, PowerPoint presentations, logos, etc.
- The Marketing Coordinator participated in a new promotion to target high school students and their parents by sponsoring a rival football game between Coconino and Flagstaff High School. The College provided hand held fans to 1,000 attendees of the game advertising CCC. The promotion also included advertisements during a broadcast of the game.

- The Foundation worked with Antelope Point Marina and was able to secure \$20,000 for the Antelope Point Marina Endowment and Pass Through Scholarships.
- Blue Cross, Blue Shield has agreed to renew its commitment to provide \$5,000 for scholarships for the Nursing Program. These scholarships will benefit students who are interested in practicing in rural areas of Arizona.
- Findlay Toyota has generously offered to sponsor both Palette to Palate and the Foundation Annual Meeting and Scholarship Awards event in 2018.

- Reggie Eccleston from the City of Flagstaff has agreed to join the Foundation Board.
- The Foundation hosted two lunch time events related to employee giving. The kickoff event showcased giving opportunities through the CCC Foundation and United Way. The Employee Giving Luncheon honored those employees who had donated through payroll deductions or one-time gifts. The College is appreciative of the many businesses who donated gift certificates for this event. The Employee Giving Campaign resulted in 54% of employees donating to the College.
- The Annual Appeal Letter was sent out to 1,100 donors, alumni, and prospective donors.
- The Foundation participated in efforts to promote scholarships and encourage students to apply for scholarships including Financial Aid Night at Flagstaff High School, CCC College Fair and Student Forum, promoting scholarship opportunities on Sunnyside Radio, and by creating a fillable PDF scholarship application that was distributed to high school counselors.
- To gather information on alumni including their current employment, the Foundation distributed an online survey to alumni.
- The Donor and Alumni Relations Coordinator attended a Planned Giving 202 workshop hosted by the Arizona Community Foundation.
