A. Identification:

1. Subject Area: Aerospace Studies (AES)
2. Course Number: 102
3. Course Title: Foundations of the U.S. Air Force II
4. Credit Hours: 1
5. Course Description: Role and mission of U.S. strategic offensive and defensive forces, aerospace support forces, and general purpose forces; examines selected geopolitical determinants and constraints relating to the use of national power; basic theory and principles of flight; basic communication skills. Students interested in a future career in the Air Force have co-requisites: AES 112 and AES 250 or Consent of Instructor. One lecture.

B. Course Goals: Upon completion of this course students will know the mission, organizational structure, and customs and courtesies of the United States Air Force (USAF). Students will have a basic understanding of the career opportunities, military pay and other benefits available upon commissioning in the USAF. Finally, students will be able to demonstrate the concepts of professionalism, officership, and most importantly the Air Force Core Values (Integrity, Service before Self, and Excellence in All We Do) required of all future leaders in the USAF.

C. Course Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. identify Air Force core values;
2. identify the means of successful communication;
3. identify the key elements of the process of communication including effective listening and interpersonal interactions;
4. identify the basic principles of leadership;
5. participate in team building exercises;
6. identify diversity and harassment;
7. and present an oral communication, which demonstrates effective briefing techniques.
