5. Catalog Description:

Fundamentals of criminal investigation. Examines theory of criminal investigation, crime scene procedures, case preparation, basic and advanced <u>interviewing</u> techniques, and basic investigative techniques. Three lecture.

B. <u>Course goals:</u>

To provide the students with the necessary skills to prepare them for understanding the contemporary environment of criminal investigation in the United States and the sub-systems which directly comprise the integrated systems within the United States and to emphasize the functional areas of criminal investigation techniques and the applications as preparation for: problem-solving, communication, reasoning, and reporting. Course to include concepts of forensic interviewing. Computer worksheet applications may be utilized.
